WE NEED FOOD YEAR ROUND

CT NOFA was awarded a grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to develop a program specifically for specialty crops in Connecticut. Titled “**Winter Food: Growing, Storing, Marketing and Cooking Specialty Crops for the Cold Season**”, this program will focus on increasing the availability, sales and consumption of locally-grown, organic and sustainable fruits, vegetables and herbs in the winter and on educating farmers in the best practices for growing, storing and marketing winter crops.

THIS PROJECT SEEKS TO INCREASE SALES AND CONSUMPTION OF WINTER FOOD grown and stored on Connecticut farms through a range of educational and outreach activities.

The rise in the number of winter farmers’ markets and winter CSAs indicates the interest in year round, CT Grown eating.

The three year project includes:

- Farmer survey
- On-farm workshops on
 - Greenhouse growing
 - On-farm storage
 - Processing facilities
- Cooking workshops
- Winter Food Tracks at Conferences
- Recipes on the web and in Gleanings
- Special section in two CT NOFA Farm and Food Guides

DEB’S DRIED APPLES

Slice your favorite unpeeled apples into 16 slices. (One of those corer/slicer gadgets makes the job go a lot more quickly.)

Sprinkle with a small amount of lemon juice, if available. For seasoning, use a mix of mostly cinnamon, with a bit of nutmeg, cardamom and cloves to your preference.

Arrange in a single layer in each dehydrator rack and dry for 20-24 hours. Store in glass jars.

My all-time favorite apples for this are Ginger Golds, with Monroes running a close second, from High Hill Orchard in Meriden, CT.



You can eat more Connecticut Grown Fruits and Vegetables in the Winter. Here’s how:

1. Participate in a winter CSA. See an updated list of winter CSAs. (Visit www.ctnofa.org for lists, more resources and other details.)
2. Shop at one of the growing number of Winter Farmers Markets.
3. Stock up on easy-to-store fruits and vegetables in the fall. Onions, garlic and winter squash are very easy to store for months. With a simple root cellar, many vegetables such as potatoes, beets, carrots and other root crops can also be kept for months, even without ideal conditions.
4. Use a cold frame to produce fresh greens through much of the winter. Plant spinach, lettuce and Asian greens in a simple cold frame in the fall to produce fresh greens through much of the winter. More farmers are doing this too, with high and low tunnels.
5. Learn to grow and use uncommon storage crops such as rutabaga, giant kohlrabi and celeriac.

6. Dry fruits and vegetables to preserve the goodness of summer. Simple home dehydrators will turn sliced tomatoes, peppers, and fruits into easy to store sources of flavor and nutrition.
7. Put up tomato and apple sauces, pickles, jams and jellies by canning. Apple and tomato sauces can be frozen, too.

Many vegetables can be stored for a long time using simple methods. Generally vegetables store best under one of four conditions:

1. Cold and moist; 2. Cool and moist; 3. Cool and dry; 4. Warm and dry.

Although each of these has a specific ideal temperature and humidity associated with it, if the conditions had to be perfect, people wouldn’t have been able to live in cold climates for thousands of years.

Cold and moist conditions are at or near 32 degrees Fahrenheit with 95 percent humidity, the conditions found in a traditional root cellar, dark, cold and very moist. They are perfect for long-term storage of root crops such as carrots, beets, parsnips, rutabagas and celeriac as well as apples, pears and late cabbage. Late harvested potatoes also are best stored in these conditions, although ideally they are stored at a little higher temperature (39 degrees) and less humidity (90 percent).

Cool and moist conditions, about the same as ideal conditions for storing potatoes or 40 degrees and 90 percent humidity, are those found in a refrigerator and are for shorter term storage (days or weeks) of vegetables and fruits such as beans, cucumbers, melons and sweet peppers.

Cool and dry conditions, 32 degrees and 65-70 percent relative humidity, are perfect for storing onions and garlic. However, we’ve found that even at less than ideal conditions, July harvested garlic (properly dried and cured) and summer harvested onions, keep well into spring.

Warm and dry conditions, 50 to 60 degrees and 50 to 85 percent relative humidity, are good for hot peppers, pumpkins, winter squash and sweet potatoes. Sweet potatoes need curing at higher temperatures before storage and like the higher temperature and humidity in this range. WHAT IS "ORGANIC," ANYWAY?

CERTIFIED
ORGANIC FARMS

A **CERTIFIED ORGANIC FARM** is in compliance with the National Organic Program (NOP) standards, and has been inspected and certified by an accredited USDA certifying agent. Products have been grown/raised without the use of synthetic fertilizers, pesticides, growth hormones, irradiation, or genetic engineering. The certification process is rigorous and requires extensive record keeping, payment of an annual fee, and an annual inspection. Additional information can be found at their site:

www.ams.usda.gov/AMSv1.0/nop The National Organic Program allows farmers who sell less than \$5,000 worth of organic produce per year to call their produce "organic" in retail sales if they follow the national standards. This produce is not certified.

C **T NOFA Farmer's Pledge** is a commitment to farming, marketing and farm management in accordance with sound ecological and economic principles. It is separate and distinct from "Certified Organic." There is no inspection process for the Farmer's Pledge, but the farmers have signed the Pledge to show their commitment to its principles. CT NOFA administers the Farmer's Pledge program in Connecticut. However, we do not investigate or make any guarantee that the individual farmer is complying with the Farmer's Pledge.

E **VERY SPRING**, all our Farmer's Pledge farms are featured in our annual Farm & Food Guide. Last year 15,000 copies of the Guide were printed and distributed all over the state at farmers markets, agricultural and environmental events, and wherever people were looking for healthy and sustainably grown food. In addition the Guide is posted on our website, so your farm's listing is available to everyone who visits www.ctnofa.org. It's a great way to spread the word about your farm.

All you have to do to be included in the program is to sign a copy of the Pledge and return it to CT NOFA. We'll initial, date, laminate and return it to you. You are encouraged to display your copy of the Pledge at your farm, farm stand, farmers' markets and anywhere else where folks care about good food. CT NOFA keeps a copy of the Pledge for our records. To participate you or your farm must be a CT NOFA member. The Farmer's Pledge must be renewed each year, and CT NOFA will contact you each winter to get your Pledge updated.

K **nowing your farmer** is the best assurance that the food you buy is responsibly grown; grown with methods that recognize the inherent implications of the web of life in all our individual actions. CT NOFA (The Connecticut Northeast Organic Farming Association) believes that farmers should work in harmony with natural forces and leave the little piece of the world over which they have stewardship in better condition than when they found it.

To further enable consumers to identify the farms they want to support with their food dollars, CT NOFA is using the Farmer's Pledge, separate and distinct from USDA Certified Organic. Farmers and market gardeners who adhere to the following pledge have signed a copy which they display for customers and neighbors to view. This pledge is based on the integrity of the farmer/gardener. Those who sign this pledge agree that consumers may inspect, by appointment, their farm/garden to judge the truthfulness of this statement. CT NOFA does not investigate or make any guarantee that the individual farmer is complying with the Farmer's Pledge.

WE PLEDGE THAT IN OUR FARMING, PROCESSING AND MARKETING WE WILL:

- ✦ Reject the use of synthetic insecticides, herbicides, fungicides & fertilizers
- ✦ Reject the use of GMO's, chemically treated seeds, synthetic toxic materials, irradiation & sewage sludge
- ✦ Treat livestock humanely by providing pasture for ruminants, access to outdoors & fresh air for all livestock, banning cruel alterations, & using no hormones or antibiotics in feed
- ✦ Support agricultural markets & infrastructures that enable small farms to thrive
- ✦ Maintain & build healthy soils by farming practices that include rotating crops annually, using compost, cover crops, green manures & reducing tillage
- ✦ Conserve natural resources by reducing erosion & pollution of air, soil & water through responsible farming practices

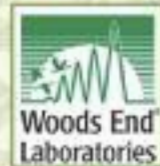

Grown ingredients with chefs and other foodservice professionals. It also helps the public locate restaurants and other dining venues that serve CT Grown foods.

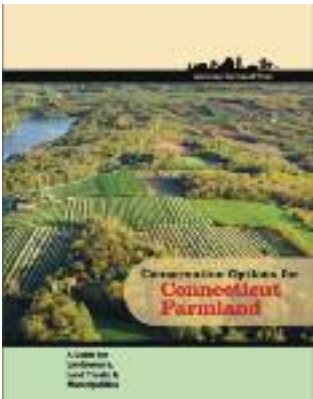

WHAT IS A COMMUNITY FARM?

Generally, it is a farm on public land or land owned by a nonprofit organization, guided by a non-profit board or a town commission toward a mission of service to the community. Food is often distributed through a Community Supported Agriculture program to local shareholders. Many community farms also provide food through local service organizations to people in need of fresh, healthy produce. In addition to food, the community farms may provide educational programs, a place for public events, walking trails, wildlife habitat, and preservation of historic farm buildings.

Community Farms in Connecticut can be found in all stages of development, from long-established institutions like Holcomb Farm to newly formed



non-profits trying to establish a farm. Contact the community farm in your area, find out what they are doing, and see how you can help.
